Teacher guide - Ages 8-10

Preparation

Review the lesson material beforehand. Some materials are required (see Materials section below). In this concluding lesson, you have the opportunity to choose which of the components you still want to do as a conclusion to this educational course.

Selection menu

You can choose directly which components you would still like to cover.

Final assignment

[Slide 3 - 5]

Together with the class, look at the notice board filled with the (newspaper) articles collected during the course. What do the students notice? What did they collect the most, and what problems are these articles about? Explain that they will be working in groups making a theme poster. Discuss tips for making a poster with them. In any case, give the students the tip that they can use the information from the notice board and the themes. On the next slide, the students can form groups and write their names next to a topic. If not all topics were covered during the course, it is best to remove those that were not covered. You can also choose to have two groups that have chosen the same theme, to work together. Make sure that at least one group works on the theme: trees.

Certificate

Watch the Life Terra video together and then click on the cord to reveal the certificate. You can choose to fill in only the name of the group on the certificate, the name per individual student, or let the students write their names on it. It is best to duplicate the page several times first. You can print the certificates via the print button, which is under the save button. But please consider the environment before printing!
